Building Works: A New Classroom

After a final meeting with our Site Manager from Classic Builders this morning, and I can share with you the exciting news that the building work for our new classroom begins this week. The proposed timescale is May to August and we should be able to use the new classroom in September 2022.

There are naturally some logistics to consider, every aspect of the build has been risk assessed to ensure the safety of everyone who uses our school site. The most obvious change will be how the children, staff and visitors enter and leave the site. There will be a fenced pathway from our front pedestrian gate to the front door of the school; all children will use this and go through the hall to their classes. See green strip on the plan below.

The school car park will form part of the building compound and there will be no onsite parking. If parking becomes a challenge outside of the school, can I politely suggest that anyone who is able to walks to school, hopefully the weather in summer term will be on our side. There is also the option to park and stride from the village hall.
