# Luxulyan School Uniform Policy

Uniform is very important and we expect all parents to support our policy – all pupils are required to wear school uniform

#### The uniform consists of:

A bottle green top embroidered with the Luxulyan School logo (preferable) or a plain bottle green top (also acceptable). Parents may choose from the various styles as follows:

Full zip fleece

Sweatshirt – crew neck or V neck

Sweat cardigan

Cardigan

- Grey of black trousers or skirts/pinafores
- White shirts/blouses or polo shirts (long or short sleeved) but not T-shirts
- For summer: children may wear formal (not casual) grey/black shorts instead of long trousers and girls may wear checked/striped green and white dresses
- School shoes need too be black. Trainers are not to be worn, except for PE. Sandals can be worn in the warmer weather but not 'flip flop' types, 'Reefs' or 'Crocs' as they are not suitable for the school environment.
- For PE children will require a coloured T-shirt in their team colour, black shorts and plimsolls/trainers. The T-shirt can be purchased from Cornwall Screenprint.
- A PE bag will also be required which can be of any colour (this makes it easier for the children, especially the younger ones, to recognise their own bag)
- Please can all uniform be named.
- Please note: tight skirts, leggings, long baggy trousers, high heels or fashion sandals are not suitable.



#### Reception

The Reception children are taught in Ash class and they follow the EYFS curriculum. The children have high quality provision, both indoors and outdoors. The children are taught by a wide range of inspirational adults and join in regularly with the rest of the school at lunchtime and during whole school assemblies.

### Key Stage 1

Year 1 and 2 are primarily taught one class. Some Year 1's this year however (2020-2021) will also be taught in Ash Class, alongside the EYFS pupils to allow for a more gradual transition. The rest of the Year 1's and Year 2's will be taught in Beech class. In these key year groups we enable children to thrive and learn through a broad and exciting curriculum. With a flexible approach to Year 1, Year 2 pupils are also able to have targeted learning time, focussed on their key learning outcomes. Close links are fostered with Key Stage 2 enabling a smooth transition.

### Key Stage 2

Our Key Stage 2 classes are arranged as follows: Year 3 and 4 in Sycamore class and Year 5 and 6 in Oak Class. Our aim in Key Stage 2 is to develop our pupil's levels of independence and create young well rounded citizens who are respectful and enthusiastic. By Year 6, they should be fully prepared for the next stage in their education. In Key Stage 2 there are several options to undertake residential visits. Previous visits have included Porthpean and Delaware Outdoor Centres, River Dart camp site and the Isles of Scilly Cornwall Outdoor Centre. There are also lots of extra curricular activities on offer and we are always looking to make links with other schools to increase our competitive opportunities.



# Our School in the Community

Luxulyan School is a thriving village school with close community links. We regularly visit the village hall and church to add to our learning experiences and we have a strong link with our PALS (Parent's Association Luxulyan School). We use the local environment around us and regularly visit Luxulyan Valley. Since 2016, we have participated in the St Austell Speech and Music Festival. We are also members of Mid Cornwall Sports Network.

# Communication with Parents/Carers

At Luxulyan School we highly value our relationship with parents/carers as it is important that the school and home link is strong and effective. We actively encourage parents/carers to talk to class teachers if they have any concerns about their child. In addition, we have termly parental consultation to discuss academic progress. We use Tapestry in Reception and Class Dojo from Years 1-6 and our website is regularly updated with information. Newsletters are emailed home weekly.
