They will learn to use timelines, stories and historical sources to find out about the people featured and use historical models to explore their significance. Significant historical events, people and places in their own locality: Feast Week, House Team Saints		Geography: Coastlines This project teaches children about the physical and human features of coastal regions across the United Kingdom, including a detailed exploration of the coastal town of Whitby, in Yorkshire. Add comparison of Cornish coastline		History: Magnificent Monarchs This project teaches children about the English and British monarchy from AD 871 to the present day. Using timelines, information about royal palaces, portraits and other historical sources, they build up an understanding of the monarchs and then research six of the most significant sovereigns.

They learn about the characteristics of the four countries of the United Kingdom and find out why there are hot, temperate and cold places around the world. They also compare England to Somalia.
