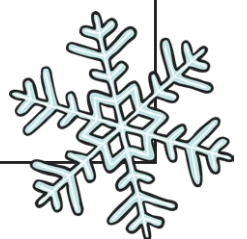

# Kwanzaa Art

Kwanzaa is an African American festival celebrated from 26th December to 1st January. It is a time for African American people to celebrate their African origins. Kwanzaa has seven principles: unity, self-determination, responsibility, cooperative economics, purpose, creativity and faith. Kwanzaa is celebrated with black, red and green to represent different things. Black symbolises people, red represents the struggle for freedom and green is the symbol of the future.

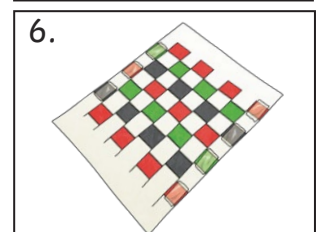
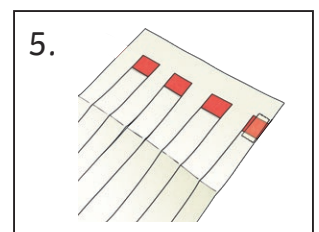
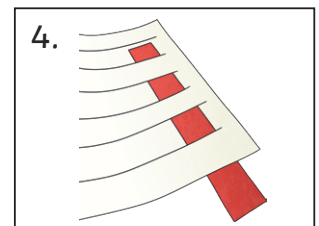
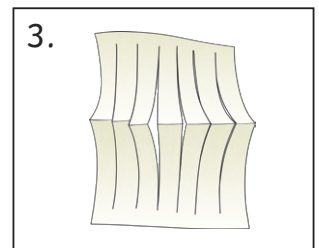
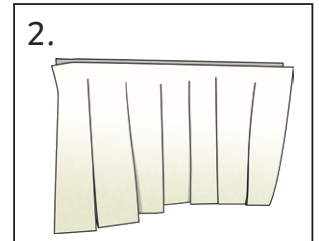
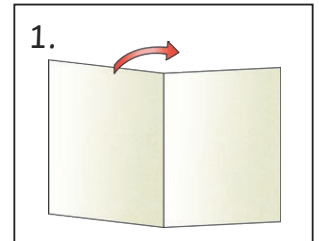
Create this piece of art using the symbolic colours of Kwanzaa.

## You will need:

- A4 paper
- black, green and red strips of paper
- scissors
- sticky tape

## What to do:

1. Fold the A4 paper in half so that the short sides meet each other.
2. Starting with your scissors on the fold line, cut towards (but do not reach) the edge of the paper.
3. Unfold the piece of paper.
4. Take the first strip of coloured paper (it doesn't matter which colour). Weave it in and out of the cuts in the paper.
5. When the strip is threaded all the way through, trim off any ends and secure them with sticky tape.
6. Repeat this process with the other strips of paper until you have filled your original piece of paper.

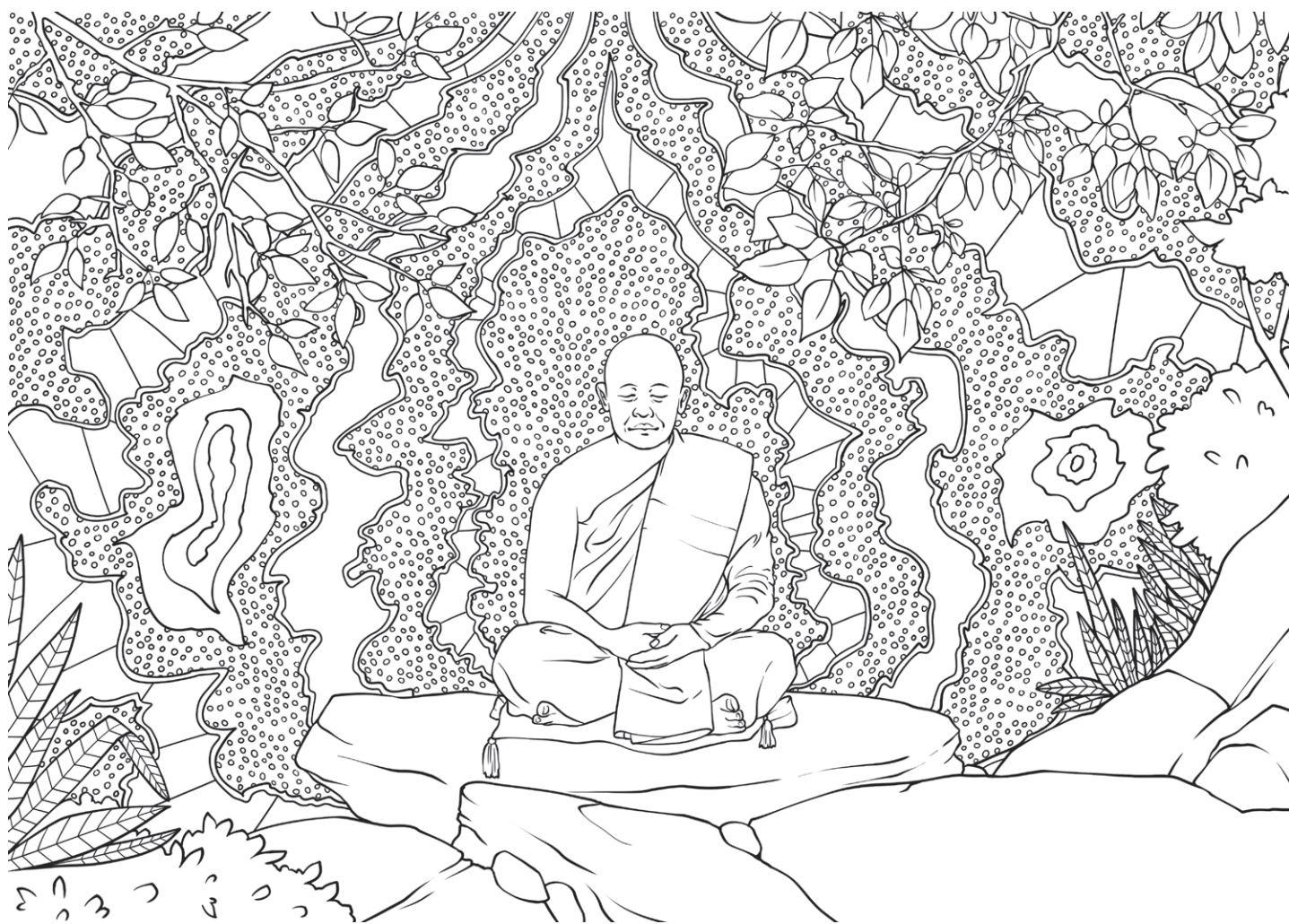
