Beech Class have become fantastic animators. We worked with Seth, Evie and Robert from Oak Class to learn how to use the iMotion app on the iPads. We had to take frame after frame of still photographs and then play them one after the other to create our film of the class moving across the playground. We then transferred this skill to create our very own stop frame superhero adventures, being careful not to take too many pictures of our hands and only to move our characters very slowly- final films coming soon to the Beech Class Dojo page!

iMotion is a free app for apple devices, if you are able to download it at home, I'm sure the children could show you how to make a short film- if not pop in and I can give you a hand to get started.

The children are currently writing their 'innovated' versions of our Traction Man Story. They have changed details in the story to make it their own, for example 'Wonder Hero' instead of Traction Man, guarding 'a bowl of cereal' instead of 'toast', changing what their hero is wearing... I'm looking forward to reading the finished masterpieces and I know they will be keen to bring copies home to share with you.

FORTNITE AND SETTING BOUNDARIES AROUND VIDEO GAMES

Please see below advice from the Child Mind Institute regarding popluar video games:

If you are a parent of a child who plays video games, Fortnite: Battle Royale is almost certainly the game in highest rotation right now. It's a cross between Minecraft and a Hunger Games-style battle-to-the-death game, but it has a cartoon aesthetic, so kids as young as about 9 are into it, and it's played with friends. And if the game is popular among kids — who, when they're not playing, are watching streams of others playing it — it's notorious among parents, who complain that it's addictive. They report kids having meltdowns when it's time to stop playing or the game doesn't go their way.

This week on childmind.org we talk to parents and Child Mind Institute psychologist David Anderson about Fortnite. We explore why the game is so appealing to kids, and how parents can set boundaries to keep their kid's screen time healthy.
