RED NOSE DAY—NOT ALL SUPER HEROES WEAR CAPES!



Sunrise Club

In our initial consultation regarding Sunrise Club we had 16 responses. There are currently only 3 children who would like a place and this is not financially viable for us as we need to pay for staff to run it. Our intention is that Sunrise Club will run from 8:00 am until 8:30am, the children will then go to their class. You will be asked to book a month at a time by emailing Mrs Grubb your dates on secretary@luxulyansch.org It will be £2.50 a session and you will need to pay for a month in advance via ParentPay. The club will be an additional bubble within the school, all other COVID measures will be in place with regards to ventilation, enhanced cleaning, handwashing.









APPLYING FOR FREE SCHOOL MEALS/PUPIL PREMIUM/FUNDING FOR SCHOOL

Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2

All Key Stage 1 (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) pupils are entitled to receive a free school meal as part of the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) initiative, regardless of what benefits are being claimed.

However, some children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 and receiving Universal Infant Free School Meals may have an underlying entitlement to benefits-related Free School Meals. Children in this group are also eligible for Pupil Premium – additional funding paid to the school to support your child in their learning, so it is important to apply for benefits-related Free School Meals if you think your child may be eligible.

Children in Year 3 and above

Your child may be eligible for benefits-related free school meals if you, or the child themselves in their own right, meet the eligibility criteria.

If eligible for Free School Meals, your child will also be eligible for Pupil Premium - additional funding paid to the school to support your child in their learning.

Free School Meals Eligibility Criteria

A child is eligible for Free School Meals if their parent/carer (or the child themselves in their own right) receives any of the following benefits:

Income Support (IS) Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190 Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC) Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Support Universal Credit - Your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get) as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods

If you are claiming the benefits listed below you are NOT eligible for free school meals, regardless of what other benefits/credits are being claimed

Working Tax Credit Contribution-Based Job Seeker's Allowance and/or Contribution-Based Employment and Support Allowance

However, you will be temporarily eligible to claim free school meals if you receive a Working Tax Credit run-on, which is the payment you may receive for a further four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.
