Thanks for all the support from the parents and wider community, who have helped prepare all the children. Also a thanks to all our other children and staff for supporting our crazy timetable.


Our Year 6 had one final test to complete after the SATS finished – could they eat a doughnut without licking their lips or fingers. This proved one of their trickiest challenges....


