Kernow Young Carers

As you will know, a young carer is a child up to 18 year old who regularly helps look after a family member or friend who has a disability, illness, mental health condition, or substance misuse problem. This can include emotional and / or practical support. Young carers often have more responsibilities than their peers, and may face challenges such as:

- feeling isolated or lonely
- struggling with school
- experiencing stress, anxiety, or depression,
- having low self-esteem or confidence
- lacking time for hobbies or social activities
- missing out on opportunities for education, training, or employment

Our young carers may not always recognise themselves as carers or may be reluctant to ask for help. They may feel guilty, ashamed, or worried about the consequences of disclosing their situation. They may also face stigma or discrimination from others who do not understand their role. So, it is doubly important that we recognise when children may have caring responsibilities and are curious about the impact this is having upon their lives. It is also supportive if we are able to signpost them to services that can help them and to make adjustments within school when their caring responsibilities are impacting on their school life. This support can have a real impact on our young carers and make a challenging situation a little bit easier.

How do they help?

Kernow Young Carers provide support for young carers in Cornwall. They aim to support with self-manage caring responsibilities, providing information, advice and guidance over the phone and working with schools. We also provide 1-1 work with Young Carers and Young Adults as well as offering activities on a regular basis and during the holidays.

house, outside the home.

•Emotional support-
listening, talking and
showing empathy.

•Personal care-
undressing/dressing,
bathing, using the toilet.

•Managing the family budget -
paying bills, seeking benefits,
working to contribute
financially.

•Supporting with
Communication -
Making calls, relaying needs
to professionals, helping a
sibling communicate.

•Dealing with Medication -
collecting prescriptions,
giving medication,
attending appointments.

•Supporting family
members during crisis -
calling emergency services,
providing emotional
support during hospital
visits, dealing with the
trauma after the event.

•Looking after siblings -
feeding, bathing,
dressing, homework,
emotional support.

•Completing daily
nursing tasks -
clearing peg/breathing
tubes, personal care,
feeding and bathing.
